1. President:

## 2. First Vice President:

The BC Council of Garden Clubs Floral Design Judges Committee has made great progress in developing the remainder of the flower arranging courses, levels 1 through 6.

There has been Level 1 - Introduction to Traditional Design classes in both Victoria and Mid- Island. The floral design judges have been trained to teach Level 2 – Introduction to Contemporary Design. The accompanying student books and instructor books have now been proofread.

The next step is to revise the BCCGC Floral Design Judging and Exhibiting Standards Manual.

Some of the BCCGC floral design judges have been taking Advanced Judges Training on Zoom hosted by NAFAS in the United Kingdom. Four of these floral design judges took part in judging floral design shows in Australia while they were there for a World Association of Floral Artists (WAFA) seminar. A great accomplishment for our judges to be able to judge floral art on the international stage.

As First Vice President, I am responsible for all the BCCGC floral design judges and the BCCGC horticultural judges in the province. I am also the chairperson of the Floral Design Judges Committee and the Horticultural Judges Committee. BCCGC offers on-line courses to become a horticultural judge and in-person courses to learn how to make flower arrangements and in-person courses to become a Floral Design Judge.

## 3. Second Vice President

Day of Event (DOE) insurance FAQ is on the website now. The DOE insurance may be a useful tool for your events, functions, and other activities in order to ensure that attendees or volunteers at events or functions who are not members of your club are covered by insurance. However, the DOE insurance is a “one-off” insurance and cannot be used again in a calendar year. For non-members attending events or functions for your community garden or garden club on a multiple basis in a calendar year, you may wish to consider “Associate” or “Non-Voting” members for your garden or club. The only real cost that these members need to bear is the \$2 for the insurance. They will then be covered by the BCCGC insurance umbrella.

#### 4. Treasurer

Our records were reviewed in January 2026 after the end of our fiscal year by Joyce Whinan, a member of one of our affiliated clubs. She found them to be in order and has given us a letter to that effect.

The budget for 2026 was approved by the membership at the Fall 2025 meeting. It shows a predicted profit of \$1,740 mainly because any expenses are kept to a minimum.

We hold two meetings a year, one in spring, which is our AGM, and another in the fall. Both of these meetings run at a loss because we provide excellent speakers and a catered lunch for our members whilst charging them for registration for these meetings at less than cost. All of the proceeds from the vendor tables and the draw table at the meetings go to the Scholarship Fund. Our largest source of so-called income is for insurance collected from member clubs. However, BCCGC makes no profit on these premiums as they are forwarded in full to the insurance company. Our executive are all volunteers and receive no remuneration for their positions, while costs are kept to a minimum so that overall we remain in a good position financially. We currently have several term deposits amounting to a total of \$19,510.84 and the balance in our current account at the end of February was \$47,882.71. Of this amount, we will be paying the insurance company for outstanding premiums, plus at the time of writing, we still have to make most of the payments for the two meetings to be held during this year.

I am confident that this report provides a clear overview of the Council's finances. Please feel free to raise any questions at the upcoming meeting.
